The Hindu Spiritual and Service Fair is unique and Thematic:

The most significant aspect of this fair and the pre-Fair programmes constitute great leap forward in connecting Indian spirituality to contemporary challenges.

The Fair will be thematic in features, original in exposition and contemporary in message.

The several programmes including the pre-Fair ones integrated into the Fair will philosophically explain and practically expound how Hindu spiritual values and the traditional Hindu lifestyle based on them provide solution for the critical contemporary issues of the world and India -- Environment, Ecology, Forests and Wildlife, Human values, Women's Honour and Patriotism.

The diverse programmes at the Fair showcase the Themes that flow from Hindu/Indian Spiritual Genius, Ancient Literature and Life-style commonly known as "DHARMA".



The Fair demonstrates that Hindu/Indian Spiritualism and life style is based on these values which constitute the thematic pillars of the Hindu Spiritual and Service Fair and all the pre-Fair programmes and Programmes at the Fair.

All programmes are designed to connect high Hindu/Indian spiritual values to daily lifestyle by Themes, Samskarams and Symbols. The Fair packages and presents the samskarams [mental and psychological training] to create reverence through symbols to internalise the themes as explained here

- Reverence for "Trees" through Vruksha Vandanam as symbol to Conserve Forests
- Reverence for "Snakes" through Naga Vandanam as symbol to Protect Wild Animals

[The logic is that forests will not be conserved without wild animals and wild animals cannot protected without forests]

- Reverence for "All Living Beings" through Gaja Vandanam, Go Vandanam and Tulasi Vandanam as symbols to Preserve Ecology
- Reverence for "Nature, Mother-earth, Rivers" through Bhoomi Vandanam and Ganga Vandanam as symbols toSustain Environment
- Reverence for "Parents, Elders and Teachers" as symbols to "Inculcate Family and Human Values
- Reverence for "Girls and Women" as symbols to Foster Women's Honor
- [The logic is that respect for women ensures their rights without gender conflict]
- Reverence for "Bharat Mata" and "Paramveer Vandanam" as symbols to promote Patriotism

The programmes aims to inculcate the reverence by symbols and samskarams the people of all persuasions in India are familiar with.

The core message of the Hindu Spiritual And Service Fair is founded on the confluence and inseverability of Desam [Nation] Daivam [Divinity] and Dharmam [Value system].

It means that our nation [Desam] cannot exist without our Daivam [Divinity] and our Daivam [Divinity] cannot exist without our [Desam] nation and neither exist without Value system [Dharmam]

The six themes are integrated into the value system [Dharmam] practised in this ancient land [Desam] and are exemplified by the Deivam [Divinity]
